Dear Calvary folks,

Happy new year to you all! Well, you might think that I'm jumping the gun, because that greeting might more properly given in the next month's newsletter. We just worshipped in the last Sunday of the CHURCH year, and as I am writing this, we are preparing for the first Sunday of the next church year, the First Sunday in Advent.

When I announced this change in worship on Sunday, there was some whooping going on! Which says to me that you are excited for a change from the long season of Pentecost, which follows the formation of the disciples, and by extension, the formation of the church of Jesus.

No, he said, the most important festival is Shabbat (Sabbath), the weekly congregational encounter with the Divine. (Oh, he added, if only as many people came to Shabbat worship as came to the High Holy-days!)

Let me tell you that I am very much looking forward to lighting the Advent candles and waiting with bated breath for the 24th and 25th of December, and worshiping with carols and candles and the warmth of family on Christmas Eve and the quietness of the world on December 25th.

AND, I still get LOTS of energy from meeting on regular Sunday mornings with you all, with you who are dear friends already, and always expecting someone new to surprise us with grace. I find joy in sharing your lives, and marking important milestones, and sharing in the Lord's Supper together, and laughing and crying together. What an honor it all is.

So, when the time comes, I look forward to saying Merry Christmas to All! and Happy New Year! And then I anticipate settling down again into the blessed rhythm of daily and weekly blessings from belonging to the communion of saints.

May your December be filled with light!

Actual **receipts** for October were \$10,485.44 and **actual** expenses were \$10,021.81 for a positive balance of \$463.83. Total in the checking account is \$54,185.24.

- -- We have re-instituted participation in **three music licensing programs**, by which we are able to direct support to the musicians who have written music that we use in streaming and reproduction for our worship services.
- -- The **new worship streaming system** is in place and showing forth beautiful new video for those who wish or need to watch worship services online. I have noticed that the piano is not connected to a

microphone so is pretty quiet on the recording, but I think we can remedy that problem pretty easily. Thanks to ALL those who participated in putting the system together, especially Janet Lorenzo, Pastor Mary Stein-Webber, Mike Lorenzo, Ken Brocks and volunteer helper Marshall Funk-Pihl from Mt. Carmel Lutheran Church in San Luis Obispo.

- -- The repairs to the **west sanctuary windows** have been completed.
- -- Average worship attendance for October was 38, compared with 31 last year.
- -- It is being proposed that a **new paid church position of Office Manager and Bookkeeper**, which will cover all of the tasks that have been done on a volunteer basis by current Church Treasurer, Sandy McMillan will be added to the proposed 2024 budget. Sandy has expressed her interest in filling that position, as she is stepping down from her elected position.
- -- The **Children's Christmas Program**, led by Nikki Rocha, will take place during worship on Sunday, December 10th.

Heartfelt Thank You from Brenda Ouwerkerk


On behalf of my family, I would like to send my heartfelt thanks to everyone that made my mom, Edith West's memorial service on November 4th so meaningful and joyful.
