Dear friends of Calvary,

The latest two prominent mass shootings have had an impact on me, and I know upon you. The one in Monterey Park was very close to where I grew up. My aunt lived in that city and our family would visit them fairly often. The one in Half Moon Bay, well, Mary and I passed by those nurseries as we'd visit friends in that city.

I was also struck that the shooters in each case were elderly Chinese people, which was shocking. Despite China's vast population, only a few handfuls of crimes associated with guns are committed there each year. One commentator I read confirmed this assessment. Their conclusion was that these shooters took such drastic action because they had become steeped in the American culture, where gun ownership is widespread and gun ownership is supported on the Second Amendment to the Constitution under the Bill of Rights. (And, in one case, there was probably mental illness involved, and in the other, intimations of severe workplace mistreatment.)

Which is all to say that it is likely, barring contravening national changes, that we as a country are bound to continue the current trend of an average of ONE AND A HALF MASS SHOOTINGS (incidents where at least four people, not counting the shooter, are shot at) PER DAY.

I don't know how to grieve this much suffering, with the concentric circles around victims and their families, and around perpetrators and their families, and the loss of the sense of safety for the entire population. Believe me, I am not against firearms per se. My son Philip, who showed us at a very early age how he could make a gun-like object by taking a bite out of a cookie, is a great aficionado of various weapons. He owns guns and other things that shoot projectiles (handling them with great care), he likes going shooting in the wilderness or at ranges, and even invents gun peripherals such as scopes, arrow attachments, and such. We love our son, and wish him well in his endeavors.

I understand, therefore, the attraction of items that project power, and their proper uses. And I also am coming to my own bursting point on the matter. Gun violence is a public health threat. When the number of automobile deaths grew more and more, the industry and government collaborated on the introduction of seat belts, and now on warning systems of impending collisions and other improvements. When the lead and asbestos were determined to be great threats to human health, they were banned from use in paint and pipes and insulation and other building materials.

The main reason why there are so many gun deaths in this country (the most, I believe, through self harm) is because there are so many guns at hand. My personal growing desire, besides resolving to continue praying for the potential perpetrators and inevitable victims of gun violence, is to do something about it all. I would like to have a conversation with people of Calvary on all sides of the issue. I would like to see if there is any direction of action that might arise from such conversations.

I know it's huge. I know that better and more energetic people than me have been very busy on the matter for years and years. My question in this place and at this time is, who in Jesus' name is willing to join me in thinking about solutions? And who might we join with outside our community?
