Dear friends,

As I sit here at my computer, I am mindful of a significant recent confluence of deaths of people who have been near and dear to Mary and me over the years, three of them whose memorial services are this weekend.

Rev. Larry Nelson was our "teaching parish supervisor" in seminary. During the first two years of our studies, we were assigned to a local congregation, where we would participate, take advice, and learn more about congregational life. Larry and his wife Barbara were strong and warm leaders of Trinity Lutheran Church in Alameda. Pastor Larry, a former radio announcer, had the epitome of a mellifluous voice, charming and instructive. He loved us into being better pastors, always goodhearted and positive, always showing ways to be in a mutual ministry with others.

Barbara Schaefer was wife of Pastor Marty Schaefer, mother of our friend Pam Schaefer. and ALSO receptionist at Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary, where Mary and I worked. She was alert to the needs of the people there, directed the flow of information, and was alert to the protection of the inhabitants there. She and Marty were faithful to the spirit of training pastors and present at all events.

Eldre Larsen was a consummate musician and member of the church Mary and I served in Long Beach, Christ Lutheran Church. We will be preaching at her memorial service on this Sunday, so will miss you all at worship that day. (Thanks to Joyce and Rachel for taking up pastoral responsibilities!). Eldre was warm, constantly encouraging, wise, prudent and loving. It is people like her who are the backbone of a congregation, in faith and example and leadership.

Also, the memorial service for Betty Sorensen, wife of Darel, will be held in Reedley this Saturday. That is the town where the Sorensens are from. Many folks will be able to celebrate Betty's life, and provide a warm place for fellowship and food. And I know that Calvary folks will continue to support Darel during this big transition.

I will also be present at a memorial gathering for Hugh and Marion Salas, who for many years lived in Morro Bay, where they built their own house. The family wanted the gathering here, and we at Calvary were able to provide them a loving space to do so.

One thing faith communities do well is to comfort, console and act as companions through the deaths of loved ones. We do not shy away from death's reality, primarily because we know that, living or dying, we are the Lord's.

May God continue to assist you in being helpers, in Jesus' name, for those who need aid.

Expenses were at 106.35% of the 2023 Budget for the same period.


Saying Goodbye is Hard...

Betty Amos Sorensen passed away on April 18, 2023. Betty was a caring, dedicated wife, mother and grandmother who was very proud of her family, extended families and friends. Betty and Darel celebrated 61 years of a wonderful marriage. A private burial took place at the Cayucos Morro Bay Memorial cemetery. Our cemetery marker reads: "you + me = perfect". A Celebration of Betty's life will be held on Saturday, April 29 at 2pm at Christ Lutheran Church in Reedley where they were married.

Sid Bennett - 1934 - 2023



Sydney Stuart Bennett passed away on April 8, 2023 at his home in Morro Bay. He was 88 years old. Sid was born on September 14, 1934 in Long Beach, California to parents Rev. Manford and Agnes Bennett.

After many moves, the family settled in Van Nuys, California. He met his future wife, Beryl Matson, at Van Nuys High School where he graduated in 1953. After graduation, he attended University of the Pacific, Stockton, California on a football scholarship. He also played football for Occidental College, and later graduated from Cal State Northridge.

Sid and Beryl were married in 1954 and were blessed with a baby girl, Lisa, in 1956.


Sid's work as a lay pastor at St. Andrew's Lutheran in Van Nuys led to his decision to attend Pacific Lutheran Theological Seminary in Berkeley, where he later received a master's degree in theology. During that time, Sid and Beryl were blessed once again with the birth of their son, Robert, in 1962. Sid's first parish was Calvary Lutheran Church in Morro Bay in 1964, and he later accepted a call to Our Redeemer Lutheran Church in Simi Valley, California.

Recognizing that one-on-one counseling was his strong suit, he completed his master's degree and a college counseling credential in preparation to becoming a counselor. Sid was elated to be hired at Cuesta College in 1968, teaching health, helping to coach football, wrestling and golf, and later joining the counseling department. He went on to become director of counseling and director of the Career Transfer Center and Job Placement Services. Sid's dedication to his profession at Cuesta earned him the honor of having the San Luis Obispo County High School Counselor's Conferences, hosted annually, named after him. At the Cuts Counseling Center, Sid's positive and loving encouragement influenced many young people to obtain success in school and life.

Sid was a long-time member of the Morro Bay Rotary Club, on the boards of directors for The Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial Scholarship Fund, Achievement House, Meals on Wheels, The Community Concert Association, and the Youth Symphony.

Sid's faith sustained him. He loved abundantly, unconditionally and without prejudice. His many friends were beneficiaries of that love. But his family was the greatest recipient of his ever-present love; his wife of 68 years, Beryl, his daughter Lisa and husband Bob Fiocca, his son Bob and wife Metta Stiletto, his grandchildren Olivia and Samantha Bennett, his granddaughter Milea and husband Brent Christensen, great grandchildren Niels and Sidney Christensen and his grandson Travis Smith. They all brought him so much joy and made his life complete. Sid often said, "I am the richest man in the world, and the riches have nothing to do with money." And he truly believed it!
