

## THE CALVARY CALLING

Dear friends of Jesus at Calvary,

Mary and I have subscribed for a long time to *The Christian Century*, a magazine that has generally catered to mainline Protestants. The latest issue has an article by Peter Choi, executive director of the Center for Faith and Justice in San Francisco. The subtitle of the article is "Five Ways I see a new generation reorienting its Christianity."

I found myself agreeing with each of the "Five Ways" as I reflected on how the church has and will change in order to be effective in this new society where religion no longer has a privileged place. That is perhaps the main point, that places of worship cannot rely on tradition or popular support as much today, and so must learn again what it means to be friends of Jesus in our place and time.

So here are Choi's points (with my interpretations), and how even our congregation might be moving.

- 1. **From triumphalism to lament.** Since we are no longer "in charge" or "in power," we learn how Christians have lorded it over others, and figure out how Christ's glory was truly a humbling of himself. That's our model.
- 2. **From morality to dignity.** We should indeed seek to be moral beings, discerning with the Spirit's help what is honorable and pleasing and good. But we cannot use our own sense of morality to rate other people's behavior. Instead, we can assume that others are doing best according to their own lights, thus affording dignity by default to others.
- 3. **From certainty to mystery.** Confirmation instruction and preaching, when I was first ordained, seemed to be primarily about providing answers to life's questions. Indeed we have some blessed assurances, and life-giving points of view. But it is also a sign of maturity that we do NOT have all the answers, and that much of what is holy is also difficult to explain.
- 4. From superiority to mutuality. This movement is much like #1, with the addition that others will have just as much wisdom and insight as we do, and that much of life for everybody is learning and working together.
- 5. **From rhetoric to embodiment.** This movement can be summarized as moving from" talking the talk" to "walking the walk." When it comes right down to it, people don't care how much we know until they know how much we care. And caring is best when shown in concrete actions.

So there you have it. As a retired pastor, in a bridge pastor status with you all, I have much less to prove than I did at a younger age. And that is probably a very good thing, as we seek to do what we can do in allowing the Holy Spirit to guide us in our way of being little Christs in the community of Morro Bay and surroundings!

- -Receipts for April were \$12,701.25 and expenses \$6,705.34, for an overage of \$5.996.91. The year-to-date has an overage of \$6.349.39.
- -- Liability insurance for the coming year will be due soon at a premium of about \$7,000.
- -- The designated fund of Worship Banners has been expanded to include Church Decorations of all kinds.
- -- A portion of the balance in the general checking account will be invested in an interest-bearing account.
- -- Two bids to repair the front parking area were received and compared. Nancy Koppl has been in touch with the building inspections department regarding current requirements for handicapped parking spaces. A committee of Nancy Koppl, Sandy McMillan and Pastor Brian was appointed to further investigate the matter and report back to the Council. When and if a proposal is accepted for repair, the matter will be brought to the full congregation for vote.
- -- Some informal bids were received for repair to the broken fence and gate on the back patio. Gail Brochtrup has been organizing the pre-work and will continue to do so. Should the repair job estimate be over \$2,500, that proposal will also be brought to the congregation for a vote.
- -- The Council approved a proposal to wash most of the windows in complex for about \$600.
- -- The Council will advertise suggested charitable organizations which families of our recent departed members, Betty Sorensen and Edith Tway, have designated as possible ways to honor their loved ones.
- -- The Council approved the date of June 11th, Sunday, during worship, to honor our current high school graduates, Samantha Rocha and Gwen Muff...
- -- The Council approved a congregational survey to determine if, and under which conditions, Calvary members might in the future entertain the idea of sharing our facility with another worshiping congregation.
