Dear friends of Jesus at Calvary,

Mary just read me a devotion about finding joy in the midst of darkness. It includes a story about an eminent black pastor who was receiving threats against him and his congregation. As you can imagine, the pastor was very upset and on edge. One night, he heard some rumbling in his house and suspected that it was due to an intruder, who wished him and his family harm. When he got up, courageously, to investigate, he found his daughter in her room, awake and dancing, with the most flamboyant style. He smiled and lowered his shoulders and asked what this dancing was all about. His daughter responded that she just felt like dancing. In the middle of the night.

The pastor's conclusion was to realize how important it is to retain our sense of joy and jubilation in the midst of difficult circumstances. And he noted the verses from Psalm 30, verse 5: Weeping may linger for the night, but joy comes with the morning. Which made him cry.

Jim Luke talks this way in the wake of his dear Linda's death, after much struggle. He says that he is indeed sad about her dying, but content, and even happy, that she is now not only with her dear loved ones, including her grandmother Nonnie, but also with God. This is joy in the midst of distress.

Joyce Bauer spent many days in the hospital due to her heart arrhythmia, and is now home, and the source of her heart's trouble has not yet been tracked down. But to hear her talk, she is not discouraged, but mainly glad to be sleeping in her own bed. That is joy in the morning.

My lesser current trouble with some kind of sciatica is a bit discouraging. But I know there will be a conclusion to it, and have greatly appreciated the consolation and prayers from all of you. Who knew that this is not an uncommon affliction! And I have been greatly helped by several healers.

I'm not trying to tell you that, if you are suffering, then get over it! I am saying that the psalmist's insistence that joy comes in the morning is a promise to hold onto, and one that comes directly from God. And if you're not feeling the joy, then, to paraphrase John Lennon, if you're not joyful yet, then it isn't the morning.

Thank you for your constant support of me as your bridge pastor. May I continue to be able to return in kind, to the best of my God-given abilities!

They should be tied into helping maintain and to respect our physical property, pews, carpeting, painting... there would be double the wear and tear if we shared, which is alright, but we might need financial help to keep it in good working order... the same goes with sharing utilities. Calvary is really thriving and so many good things will come of that!
 - I feel the needs of Calvary should come first. I also feel we would lose some flexibility of scheduling, but that could be worked around. I also think we need to have a plan in place of how we handle the discontinuance of use.



- **-Worship attendance** has averaged 44 for the first three Sundays of the month, which is ten people more than the average in the first part of the year.
- We have learned more of what is needed to repave and improve the **parking lot in front of the church.** It looks like we will only be able to have one legal handicapped spot, since the requirement for any such spots is that the whole part of it, in any direction, cannot have more than a 2% slope. Nevertheless, there will be other spots there close to handicapped requirements which will help our attendees.
- We are a few steps closer to **updating our video and sound**

production, with help from a member of Mt. Carmel in San Luis Obispo and Central Coast Music.

- We raised up **possible new Council members** starting next year.
- We are assessing our needs for **new banners** for special holidays or events, based on what we already have. Unfortunately, the new wall-mounted handicap parking sign will take up some of the space where we hang the banners. A solution will be sought out.
- We also worked out some of the **logistics for special celebrations** for members.
- The **organ** was tuned last week. Thanks to the tuners who travelled from Northern California!
- Pastor Brian shared some of he and Pastor Mary's **travel plans** for the next four months.

Outreach

The new group, "Caring for God's Creation" has nearly completed the display board. First topic will be laundry detergent sheets.



Ideas for a fund raiser for our Compassion Child Charite were discussed. There will possibly be a bake sale in September. Some of the items for sale will have been baked by the Sunday School children.

God's Creation" displays starting in July.










A Letter from Our Compassion Child, Charite
