

I'm writing this note before Holy Week, but you will see it after Easter Sunday! What a challenge! Here's what I am envisioning:

Those of you who attended Palm/Passion Sunday worship will have thrilled to Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem on the back of the donkey, only to be thrown into the story of what followed. Jesus will not be the usual kind of conquering hero, but one who is humbled in front of the authorities, repeatedly, and finally subjected to a brutal death on what we call a cross. It would have been some assemblage of wood upon which his hands and feet were nailed up. Death would come, eventually, by suffocation, but Jesus died sooner than Pilate had expected. So, there was some mercy to it all. Just a little. We will have moved after worship to the fellowship hall for our own potluck brunch, a reminder that we do not walk through our Lenten journey alone.

The reason why we told Jesus' sufferings on Palm Sunday was because some of you would not be able to attend the mid-week services, and so would have gone from triumphal entry to the triumph of the resurrection, with nothing in between.

We backtracked on Maundy Thursday to Jesus' supper with his disciples, including Jesus washing the feet of the disciples, and giving them a "new" commandment, to love one another. How important those moments were in Jesus' own mind, as he was preparing his disciples to carry on without him, spreading the gospel all over the known world.

On Good Friday, Tom Anello sang for us a beautiful and touching story of a man and his two sons bringing a lamb to the temple for a sacrifice, and then noticing the other Lamb of God who was being "sacrificed." Thank you, Tom. We also considered for ourself what Jesus' death has meant for us. Ann Lucas will have blessed us with her accompaniment.

And on Easter Sunday...I can only surmise what will be full of surprises for us. The sanctuary will be bedecked with new decorations, behind the cross and hanging from the rafters. The flower tree on the lawn will be resplendent, contrasted with our friend Christian's tent, a reminder that our own eternal home is not here on earth. Andy Shen will be here again to play the piano, and we will have wonderful hymn singing. People will be in attendance that will be new to us. Some will have come with Calvary families, and others will have been led by the Holy Spirit. I picture that you all will have welcomed them warmly.

This is one of my favorite parts of congregational life, that wonderful things happen that nobody could predict. And funny things happen that are not scripted. And difficult things pop up that we seek to handle together, with the help of the holy angels and the Guiding Spirit.

So, into Easter season, this I know. We will be trying out a new liturgical setting, called Beneath the Tree of Life. The worship planning committee has commented that the music is easy to learn and the words meaningful. I suspect that the liturgy will come to be one of your favorites. And there will be seven Sundays in the Easter season that will give us plenty of time to become accustomed to the new liturgy.

And meanwhile, we will be seeking to follow the "new" commandment of Jesus to love one another. We won't be perfect at it, but the extent to which we practice love for each other, both inside and outside of the church, will be leaven for the world.

Receipts \$10,834.00. Expenses - \$7,766.55. Income was at 99.69% of the 2024 Budget for the two (2) months ended 02/29/2024. Expenses were 89.64% of the 2024 Budget for the same period.

A big thank you to Ken Foran who has created another stunning stained and etched glass window for our Sanctuary. The center panel is a replica of the etched glass that was on our gate for many years. Last year's storms damaged the fence and gate beyond repair and were replaced. Unfortunately, the etched glass could



not be saved, so Ken recreated it. A description of the meaning of the colors in the colored glass window is below.



The three White crosses represent the sacrifice of Calvary. The Orange circle is God, never ending..no beginning, no end. The Yellow intertwining design is the Trinty - Father, Son, Holy Spirit. Brown represents the Earth and Blue the Sky. The off White are the 12 Appostles that spread the word of God. The iridescent White/Blue is the Grace of God raining down on Earth. Light Green is the color of Hope from the sacrifice of Calvary.

Dark Green represents the people of the church worldwide linked by faith and hope.
