GATHERING Come, Thou Long Expected Jesus #254 (red hymnal, rear section)

Come, thou long-expected Jesus, born to set thy people free; from our fears and sins release us; let us find our rest in thee. Israel's strength and consolation, hope of all the earth thou art, dear desire of ev'ry nation, joy of ev'ry longing heart.

Born thy people to deliver, born a child and yet a king; born to reign in us forever, now they gracious kingdom bring. By thine own eternal Spirit rule in all our hearts alone; by thine all-sufficient merit raise us to thy glorious throne.

[Author Charles Wesley, part of the early Methodist movement, wrote about 6500 hymns. He was the Wesley's 18th child, and became a "King's Scholar" at an early age. He accompanied his brother John to Georgia as a missionary in 1735, but soon returned to become an itinerant and field preacher. His notable for caring for the prisoners at Newgate Prison in London.]

He also designed seals, stained glass windows and liturgical ornaments, and became an Episcopal priest himself in Plattsburg, New York and Williamsport, Pennsylvania. He delivered the eulogy at the funeral of President Ulysses S. Grant.]

WORD

God speaks to us in scripture reading, preaching and song.

First Reading: Isaiah 35:1-10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God.

Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart,

"Be strong, do not fear! Here is your God. God will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. God will come and save you."

No lion shall be there, nor shall any ravenous beast come up on it; they shall not be found there, but the redeemed shall walk there.

And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David.

He will reign over the house of Jacob forever,

and of his realm there will be no end."

SERMON HYMN

No Wind at the Window

No wind at the window, no knock on the door; no light from the lampstand, no foot on the floor; no dream born of tiredness, no ghost raised by fear: just an angel and a woman and a voice in her ear.

"O Mary, O Mary, don't hide from my face Be glad that you're favored and filled with God's grace. The time for redeeming the world has begun, and you are requested to mother God's Son."

This child must be born that the kingdom might come: salvation for many, destruction for some; both end and beginning, both message and sign; both victor and victim, both yours and divine.

No payment was promised, no promises made; no wedding was dated, no blueprint displayed. Yet Mary, consenting to what none could guess, replied with conviction, "Tell God I say yes."

[The author of this hymn, John L. Bell, was born in Scotland and became a music teacher, from which postion he became frustrated. He moved to London where he sered in a deprived neghborhood and became a Reformed pastor. He served the youth of a wide region in Scotland, and wrote hymns to address social issues, such as unemployment, the diverse culture and child abuse. He wrote the book The Singing Thing.]
