GOSPEL LESSON: Matthew 3:1-12

[The author of this hymn, Charles Coffiin, served first as principal of the college at Beauais, France starting in 1712, and then rector at the University of Paris in 1718. He was instrumental in the construction of the Paris Breviary. In the preface to a collection of his hymns, he wrote: "In the further writing of these Hymns, I thought it advisable not so much to indulge a poetical spirit, as to be consulted with reverence and piety. Most of the arguments, therefore, I drew from the pure sources of the Holy Scriptures, in order to tie them to the suitable numbers of the Church's song."]
