[Paul writes:]

For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law,

for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed,

and is attested by the law and the prophets,

the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe.

For there is no distinction, since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God;

they are now justified by God's grace as a gift,

through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus,

whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood,

effective through faith.

God did this to show divine righteousness,

because in God's divine forbearance

God had passed over the sins previously committed;

it was to prove at the present time that God alone is righteous

and that God justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

Then what becomes of boasting?

It is excluded.

By what law?

By that of works?

No, but by the law of faith.

For we hold that a person is justified by faith

apart from works prescribed by the law.
