FIRST LESSON: Genesis 50:15-21

[The congregation will read the **bold** words.]

Realizing that their father was dead, Joseph's brothers said,

So they approached Joseph, saying,

"Your father gave this instruction before he died,

Those who eat must not despise those who abstain,

and those who abstain must not pass judgment on those who eat;

for God has welcomed them.

Who are you to pass judgment on servants of another?

It is before their own god that they stand or fall.

And they will be upheld, for God is able to make them stand.

Some judge one day to be better than another, while others judge all days to be alike.

Let all be fully convinced in their own minds.

Those who observe the day, observe it in honor of the Lord.

We do not live to ourselves, and we do not die to ourselves.

so then, whether we live or whether we die, we are God's.

For to this end Christ died and lived again, so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living.

CHILDREN'S CONVERSATION

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Open Your Ears #519 (verse 1) (red hymnal, front section)

Open your ears, O faithful people, open your ears and hear God's word. Open your hearts, O royal priesthood, God has come to you.

Gospel Lesson: Matthew 18:21-35

The gospel lesson for this Sixteenth Sunday after Pentecost is from the 18th chapter of the Gospel of Matthew, beginning with the 21st verse.

Glory to you, O God.

(The congregation shall read the bold words.)

Peter came and said to [Jesus],

"Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive?

As many as seven times?"

Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

"For this reason the kingdom of heaven may be compared

to a ruler who wished to settle accounts with their slaves.

When the ruler began the reckoning,

one who owed the ruler ten thousand talents was brought to the ruler;

and, as the debtor could not pay, the ruler ordered the debtor to be sold,

together with their spouse and children and all their possessions, and payment to be made.

So the slave fell on their knees before the ruler, saying,

'Have patience with me, and I will pay you everything.

And out of pity for the debtor, the owner of that slave released them and forgave the debt.

But that same slave, as they went out,

came upon one of his fellow slaves who owed the slave a hundred denarii;

and seizing the fellow slave by the throat, said, 'Pay what you owe.' Then the fellow slave fell down and pleaded with the first slave, 'Have patience with me, and I will pay you.'

But the forgiven slave refused; then the forgiven slave went and threw the fellow slave into prison until they would pay the debt.

When the other fellow slaves saw what had happened,

they were greatly distressed,

and they went and reported to their owner all that had taken place.

Then the forgiven servant's owner summoned that servant and said,

'You wicked slave!

I forgave you all that debt because you pleaded with me.

Should you not have had mercy on your fellow slave,

as I had mercy on you?'

And in anger the owner handed the forgiven servant over to be tortured until that one would pay their entire debt.

So my Abba in heaven will also do to every one of you, if you do not forgive your sibling from your heart."

This is the gospel indeed.
